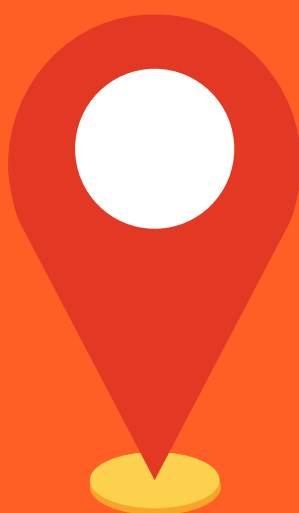

What's GSEP?

GSEP is a paid, 10-week, 100% remote summer internship to develop leaders in maternal and child health (MCH) epidemiology. Students complete a substantial project at a matched host site and participate in weekly enrichment and reflection activities.

HOST SITES – DEVELOP THE MCH EPIDEMIOLOGY PIPELINE!



- Health departments (state/territory, Native American or indigenous, local) as well as universities, non-profits, and other organizations receiving Title V support are eligible to apply.
- Provide mentorship and supervision to a full-time (35 hours per week) intern working on a needs assessment, data analysis, or program monitoring and evaluation project of your design.
- No funding commitment required; AMCHP pays and administers all intern stipends.

STUDENTS – GAIN REAL PUBLIC HEALTH EXPERIENCE WITHOUT RELOCATING!



- Currently enrolled students with a strong, demonstrated interest in epidemiology and MCH are eligible to apply.
- Put epidemiology concepts into practice at a matched host site while receiving professional mentorship.
- Explore career tracks and MCH population domains through enrichment and reflection activities with peers from across the country.
