President's Corner

Dear Colleagues,

Happy 2023! It's hard to believe our Annual Meeting in Portland, OR is less than four months away. I want to share updates on 1) what the SPER executive committee has been working on since the 2022 Annual Meeting in Chicago, IL; 2) planning for the upcoming 2023 Annual Meeting in Portland; and 3) upcoming events.



We are excited to report that SPER received an unprecedented number of abstract submissions for an in-person annual meeting! On average, the society has received 240 to 250 abstracts per inperson annual meeting since moving to an online submission system in 2009. This year SPER received 318 submitted abstracts for the 2023 Annual Meeting in Portland. Thank you to every member who participated in the abstract review. If you wish to participate in the abstract review process for the 2024 Annual Meeting that will be held in Austin, Tx, please make sure you have an active SPER membership. Membership is renewable annually and active for the calendar year dues are paid (expiring 12/31).

I'm also happy to report that we received an overwhelming number of volunteers for the Program Planning Committee. Yes, y'all filled my inbox! I received a response to our call for volunteers from more than 80 people. We are working hard to assemble the Program Planning Committee and evaluate all abstracts so that we can organize the sessions with the impactful and innovative work you submitted! Abstract decisions will be shared in April.

The preliminary program is now available on SPER's website (https://sper.org/annual-meeting-2/). The SPER Student and Postdoc Committee has planned a great advanced methods workshop with Dr. Allison Gemmill (Johns Hopkins University) and will focus on the use of interrupted times series approaches for evaluating the impacts of population or demographic shocks in relation to reproductive, perinatal, and pediatric outcomes. The workshop will be held on Monday, June 12, 2023 at noon. You can register for the workshop when you register for the annual meeting.

To accommodate the large volume of abstract submissions we will once again hold concurrent oral sessions. We will also be hosting four symposia organized by members at various career stages.

- Symposium 1: Developmental impacts of socioeconomic status on maternal and child health: The role of perceived inequality.
- Symposium 2: SGA at a dead end? Time for a paradigm shift.
- Symposium 3: Shifting towards strengths-based approaches for Indigenous family health.
- Symposium 4: Pinpointing homogenous groups in heterogeneous data: applications of latent trajectory modeling in perinatal and pediatric research.

Lastly, we are currently seeking nominations for open positions on the SPER Executive Committee: President, Treasurer, Member-at-Large, Student Representative, and International Representative. I personally have enjoyed participating on the Executive Committee. I have found it to be a rewarding experience in several ways. During the past year and a half, I have had opportunities to expand my professional network and connect with members, work closely with those whom I esteem, and address behind-the-scenes processes that affect equity, diversity, and inclusion in the Society. I give back to SPER because I want each member to feel seen, valued, and welcomed. Nominations are due March 18th. If you are interested it's totally ok to nominate yourself! The **President** will serve as President Elect (2023-2024), President (2024-2025), and Past President (2025-2026). The main duties of the President-Elect are to help the President develop plans for the Annual Meeting and to chair the selection of the Student Prize Paper Award Recipient. The International Representative (to replace Siri Haberg) participates in all Executive Committee activities, including monthly conference calls. This representative serves as a link between SPER and the pediatric and perinatal epidemiologic research communities outside of North America, with a goal of increasing SPER membership across the globe. To be eligible, the individual must reside full-time in a country outside North America.

March 28, 12 pm eastern time: SPC Journal Club: Postnatal Contraception after In Vitro Fertilization (IVF) – what do women need?

The Student/Post-Doc Committee (SPC) invites you to a discussion with Dr. Anette Thwaites from University College London on postpartum contraception after in vitro fertilization (IVF). She will be discussing her recently published work "Contraception after in vitro fertilization (IVF): a qualitative study of the views of women who have had spontaneous pregnancies after successful IVF" published in Reproductive Health. There are many different reasons why women can have problems getting pregnant, and in a quarter of cases the cause is never found. Globally, over 8 million babies have been born using IVF. Some women, who have babies using IVF, get pregnant again afterward without fertility treatment. Getting pregnant again quickly, or when a woman isn't ready, can have health consequences for the mother and the baby. Dr. Thwaites work aims to understand what

The first issue of PPE was rolled out in April 1987, stewarded by our founding (now emeritus) Editor-in-Chief, Jean Golding. We have come a long way since! Several new initiatives have been introduced in PPE in 2022-23.

With the help of our deputy editor, Jennifer Zeitlin, we reconstituted our journal's editorial board which took effect in January 2023. Look out for the updates on our journal's home page. We recently recruited 8 talented young minds as our third batch of junior editors. During the two-year period (2023-24), these junior editors will oversee the processing of manuscripts through various stages of academic publishing – from first submission to an eventual acceptance (or sadly, a rejection).
