The workshop will address the use of interrupted times series approaches for

The meeting will officially kick off mid-afternoon Monday with two amazing concurrent symposia. Julia Bittner (formerly Porth) will be leading a symposium on the developmental impacts of socioeconomic status on maternal and child health, while Allen Wilcox and colleges revisit the study of SGA and FGR. Tuesday morning, we will be starting things off with a wonderful breakfast and amazing keynote address given by Jessica Sanigaq Ullrich, an Inupiaq scholar, a tribal citizen of Nome Eskimo Community and a descendant of Kiŋiġin- the Native Village of Wales. Dr. Ullrich's work uses digital storytelling with Alaska Native youth and focuses on culturally based curriculum development, tribal child welfare prevention efforts, and connectedness for multiple systems change. Following the keynote addresses, we will have two exciting symposia and, in an effort, to increase scientific content at the meeting, we will be hosting concurrent sessions that will address pediatric research and environmental influences on perinatal and childhood outcomes. The annual meeting is also a moment of transition. My term as President ends on June 13th and we will welcome the current President-elect Penelope Howards as President. It has been my pleasure to serve as President for SPER this past year. I'm looking forward to seeing everyone in Portland! Safe travels.


