Virtual Meeting

As I write, the Virtual Meeting Program Committee is in the process of putting together four sessions from the abstracts submitted for the Virtual Meeting. In addition to these sessions, Sharonda Lovett, our (amazing) trainee representative, is developing a mentoring/networking session for trainees. One of the primary goals of the Virtual Meeting is to improve accessibility and inclusion of the Society. To that end, the Virtual Meeting is free to anyone interested in attending. Annual Meeting

I am delighted to announce that Dr. Elena Fuentes-Afflick has agreed to be the keynote speaker at our Annual Meeting. Dr. Fuentes-Afflick is the Vice Dean for the Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Professor of Pediatrics at the University of California, San Francisco. Her research has focused on acculturation, immigrant health, and health disparities, especially in Latinx populations. In addition, her scholarship has highlighted the importance of increasing diversity in academia.

The Symposium Selection Committee met in December and selected three distinct and interesting symposia for the Annual Meeting:

- Fathers Matter: Black Fathers' Involvement in Pregnancy and Beyond
- Promises and Pitfalls of Sibling Designs in Pediatric and Perinatal
 Epidemiology
- Severe Maternal Morbidity

Abstract review is currently in progress for the Annual Meeting with over 250 abstracts under consideration. Thank you to those of you completing the reviews! As I mentioned above, I will be forming the Annual Meeting Program Committee soon. Please keep an eye out for my email if you completed the Program Committee Volunteer Survey in the Fall and haven't already served on one of the committees yet.

We are also in the process of putting together an opening night panel for the Annual Meeting. The tentative title is Disparities in Pregnancy-Related Morbidity and Mortality: Where Do We Go from Here?

Finally, this year we will be presenting at least one professional development panel during lunch. Based on trainee feedback, Sharonda Lovett is developing a panel focused on career paths outside academia. Again, if she reaches out to you, I hope you will consider participating.
